Summary:

A significant part of any Order of the Arrow lodge is its commitment to Webelos Programs. A Webelos Scout is a Cub who is at their point of transition into the Boy Scout ranks. At this time in a cub's journey, learning leadership skills and important basic scouting skills is necessary for growth. The Arrowmen of the OA, being elite scouts pass on their knowledge to these growing cubs in hopes they will some day too pass on their skills. One program that is the perfect medium in which to facilitate the teaching goals, developed by the OA, is called Webelos Woods. The cubs are provided a weekend staffed by the most experienced OA members of the lodge. An exciting and vigorous program that spans the whole weekend keeps the scouts and their leaders busy. Learning basic knots, fire building, cooking, camping, and other scoutly topics serves as a place to incorporate teamwork and fellowship, one of the OA's key principals. Hands on activities and games encourage the cubs to put their heads together and their hands together to make light work and problem solve. At the end of the day a camp wide game such as a scavenger hunt and relay race bring the Packs and Dens together to make use of some of their newly acquired knowledge. Allowing the Webelos to understand teamwork, brotherhood, scout spirit, and most importantly, fun, makes for a great start in their Boy Scout endeavors. In addition, this weekend serves as an introduction to the concept of "youth led" as opposed to "adult led". It is our goal to foster a desire in these young scouts to continue in the program and become tomorrow's leaders.
